In the present review paper, we have just presented the different forms of vulnerability as floating in the research community, and the same was explained in Figure 2. We have not provided any definition of vulnerability or definition of the other terms associated with the study of flood vulnerability of our own.
2	In Table 3 for example the authors define risk as a function of hazard and vulnerability, while the widely agreed concept used by the IPCC and others define hazard as a function of hazard, exposure and vulnerability	The different definition mentioned and explained in Table 3 is the opinion of various researchers and scientists worldwide. Since the present paper is a review paper, it is necessary to incorporate the vision of different researchers in the paper.
3	In the second part of the introduction chapter new terms are introduced but often they are not clearly defined and used in an ambiguous way.	A per the authors' opinion, there is no new term used in this section. We only elaborated the different concepts used by various researchers in our own words for easy transfer of knowledge.
